

ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT OF VULNERABLE PERSONS

This service is aimed at empowering economically vulnerable people by engaging them in sustainable social and economic activities. The assistance can be obtained from Home Economics extension officers in all districts.

Who qualifies for support?

- Temporary destitute person
- Potential destitute person
- Registered with the Social and Community Development department

What kind of assistance do I get?

- Grants for small projects
- Skill development
- Referrals for further training and mentoring

Examples of rehabilitation projects

- Recycling; paper, tins, used tyres, plastics, fabric remnants
- Services; laundry, day-care, house/office cleaning, catering, shoe shine, car wash
- Arts and crafts; fine arts, basketry, leatherwork
- Brick moulding
- Food processing
- Bakery
- Crop and animal production; fruitrees, vegetables, poultry, dairy, small stock etc.
